#### **Charitable Purposes**

The charitable purpose of the society is to:

- Preserve the architecture, historic character and ambience of the Royal Burgh of Crail
- Improve and maintain the amenity thereof
- Co-operate with and support the work of the Trustees of Crail Museum

#### Structure and Management and Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

The society is set up as an unincorporated charitable association, governed by constitution. At an annual general meeting, held in February each year, office-bearers and committee members are appointed to run the day-to-day business of the society. Any member of the society is eligible to become a committee member or office bearer. Nominations are sought in advance of the annual general meeting at which elections are held and the results announced. The term of office is three years. All committee members are trustees of the society. No committee member or office bearer has any right to appoint a committee member. No committee member or office-bearer receives any remuneration but reimbursement of reasonable expenses is allowed with prior authorisation by the Chairman or Vice Chairman and supported by receipts. Financial accounts are ratified by the members at the Annual General Meeting.

#### **Risk Management**

The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those relating to the operations and finances of the charity, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate the charity's exposure to the major risks.

#### **Review of the Activities and Achievements**

There was a large deficit in the CPS finances during this year, -£26,414. This is explained by the two main projects being completed and paid for during the financial year, while some of the funding was received in the prior financial year, final funding was received in 2022/2023.

The Lumsden monument is located in the northwest corner of the Crail Kirkyard. Initially CPS had raised over £30,000 in funding commitments to enable conservation works to be carried out on the monument. £10,000 was received from Fife Council Bereavement Services, £10,000 from NE Fife Graves Dressing Fund & £10,000 was received from The Pilgrim Trust in November 2022. During the project an additional £8,336 was received from the Graves Dressing Fund due to additional costs. The Lumsden Association also kindly donated to the project. The main works were completed by September 2022, but the final retention invoice and final architects certificate will be received in May 2023. The cost will be approximately £48,000 and will have been fully funded.

Some interesting matters regarding funding developed during the execution of the Lumsden monument.

Firstly CPS was offered funding by our FC Community Officer as the Graves Dressing Fund had an annual income of ~£10,000 and invested funds of over £360,000. This was good news and should mean we can continue with the Kirkyard campaign of works.

Secondly Historic Environment Scotland made us aware of the DCMS Memorial Grant Scheme. For work carried out on memorials it is possible to apply for grants to the value of all VAT payments made on all project components. This resulted in ~£7,400 funding for the Lumsden Monument.

The Crail Mercat Cross project was completed in the summer of 2022, with funding raised from Historic Environment Scotland, Fife Environment Trust (for SLCF) and Crail Common Good Fund. Crail Museum and Heritage Centre also funded £2,580 towards the development of the interpretation panel. The final cost will be known in June 2023 once the defects period has expired and we receive the architects final certificate. The cost will be approximately £27,000 and will have been fully funded.

Further to the DCMS Memorial Grant Scheme information above. The Mercat Cross has on its lowest north facing step a dedication to Queen Victoria. We asked the question as to whether this becomes classified as a memorial. The answer was yes, and resulted in £3,958 of funding for the Mercat Cross project.

The Doocot continues as a very significant feature on the Fife Coastal path, and it was pleasing to record some very welcome donations to the facility in the financial year, which will be used for the ongoing upkeep and maintenance of this important asset for the society.

As ever the Denburn Diggers have completed another year of outstanding work in Denburn Wood. Storm Arwen (2021) created some significant damage most notably two fine mature trees completely lost. Significant CPS costs were incurred to clear these.

CPS as the owner of the museum buildings purchases the buildings insurance for 62/64 Marketgate, and is fully reimbursed by Crail Museum and Heritage Centre.

# **Reserves Policy**

The society maintains levels of reserves sufficient to meet fluctuations in its receipts and payments, fund future plans and provide cover against future contingencies and risks. The statement of balances shows £50,637 of bank balances at the year end.

#### 9. Funds

#### **Purposes of Unrestricted Funds**

Unrestricted funds are those that may be used at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the objectives of the charity.

# **Purposes of Restricted Funds**

Restricted funds may only be used for specific purposes. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for specific purposes.

The Kirkyard Fund – Crail Kirkyard (a Fife Council owned cemetery) contains some of Scotlands most significant mural monuments from the 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> centuries. CPS is committed to a campaign of conservation work that aims to retain the significant features of these monuments.

Denburn Park Fund – Denburn Park is a CPS owned asset, that CPS has plans to change from an agricultural field to a community asset with paths and a desirable green environment.

Mercat Cross Fund – The Crail Mercat Cross is a common good asset (owned by Fife Council) that needed conservation work completed and site changes to elevate its position in Marketgate.

#### **Purposes of Designated Funds**

Designated funds are not restricted but allocated by the Trustees to ensure that adequate funding is in place for certain projects.

The Doocot Fund – The Doocot is a CPS owned asset that was renovated to position it as a valued historical and educational visitor site on the Fife Coastal Path. It is now featured in a book <a href="https://documents.org/11.11/2016/bit.11.21">11.11/2016/bit.11.21</a> lighting and annual structural maintenance are supported.
